

Data Protection reform in local government & General Data Protection Regulation Three Regional Conferences: Manchester, London, Birmingham

On 25th May 2018, the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) goes into effect. These mandate new requirements for organisations relating to the protection and management of personal data. It's no longer just about organisations storing and securing data, it's about capturing the context of data and being able to prove everything is being done to protect the subject's data and the rights of the subject him or herself. The new regulations will impact almost every area of local government business – hardcopy, electronic, website data, images, recordings and written records. Organisations who failed to prepare for these changes leave themselves open to heavy penalties in the form of fines for up to €20 million or 4% of revenue/turnover for any infraction.

We are planning three regional events for local authorities in England which will bring together officers and councillors tasked with implementation and oversight of the new regulations with regulators, data experts and support networks to consider all aspects of the preparations needed and the approaches being advised. The day will take the form of morning plenary sessions and afternoon seminar workshops
