
Natural Neighbourhoods

Demographic and financial pressures mean that the way councils deliver services needs to change. Traditional administrative and statistical geographies used to track information often bear little relevance in the real world, where services would be improved by delivering to places without 'official' definitions.

The Natural Neighbourhoods tool was created with this purpose in mind and allows you to map real, meaningful areas that currently may not exist formally. This integral part of LG Inform Plus gives users the ability to view data through new lenses. From hamlets to NHS regions, any imaginable type of area can be mapped and explored using official data, recalculated automatically by the system.

Once published, these personal geographies are shared so everyone can benefit from them.




Records retention

Clear and compliant guidance for records managers

Councils are required by law to keep records for a certain period of time. Keeping records for too long or for not long enough can be a problem, either increasing the costs of storage, or if records are not available or not compliant, raising the risk of fines. This is a complex, litigious area which this guidance simplifies.

LG Inform Plus provides retention guidance for every 'customer centred' service delivered by local government, as well as some internal services. Produced in partnership with Kent County Council's Legal Services team, the information ensures compliance with Section 12 of the Lord Chancellor's Code of Practice as well as helping to meet business needs. It is maintained against a changing legislative framework and has the potential to save substantial costs and time.

Powers and Duties


A new way to design services

Councils and fire and rescue services continually improve and reshape their services. Understanding the legal duties authorities are required to perform is key and may even improve service delivery.

By highlighting which services are mandatory and which are optional, the Powers and Duties tool supports decision making. It encourages a re-evaluation of resources, challenging the status quo against the statutory framework placed on local government.

Produced in partnership with Kent County Council's Legal Services team, the information ensures compliance with statute in England and Wales for many different bodies of local government.

Application Programming Interface (API)

Easily accessible, local open data for everyone

LG Inform Plus' Application Programming Interface (API) or 'direct data feed' allows subscribers to view and download the local open data stored in its database. Over 5,000, regularly updated, data items are available from an array of different sources. The data feed has been built for use by both technical and non-technical subscribers, to deliver data that matters easily.

The direct data feed is also perfect for enriching apps with data about local places and people, such as population, employment figures, crime rates, health, housing and transport data. Our specialist data team rigorously check and update all data from multiple sources, so you can be sure of its accuracy, timeliness and relevance.

Standards

A framework for organising how we hold and record everything we do in local government

These standards underpin service delivery and act as a prism to give a 360-degree view of local government: from functional areas to individual services, life events to resident's needs, and many more.

Each standard records the separate components of a facet of local government and each component is linked to other relevant parts, forming a framework of standard definitions that all in local government can share. For example, the Benefits Advice and Assessment service is related to the Financial Assistance need, the Advice and Welfare Rights function and Benefits section of a council's website, linking resident 'need' to a service provision.



As more councils adopt the standards in their day-to-day practices it becomes easier to publish data consistently for analysis on a much larger scale.

Categories include:

- An A to Z of all local services
- The channels of communication that each service might adopt
- The circumstances of an individual
- The functional areas of responsibility in local government
- The interactions that residents and businesses might make with their council
- The life events that an individual experiences, impacting their needs
- Performance monitoring and other metrics that challenge local government
- The needs of a resident based on their life style and circumstances
- The legislative powers and duties that underwrite council responsibilities
- The business processes that local authorities adopt to deliver services
- The full list of services delivered by local government
- The vocabularies that are used to describe local government services
- · Website navigation.
